Number and Place Value

- To write numbers to 100 as numerals and words.
- To identify and place 2 digit numbers on a number line.
- To estimate numbers using different representations.

- To read, write and interpret mathematical symbols.
- To know addition and subtraction bonds to 20 – fact families.
- To know related facts
- To know number bonds to 100.

Measurement

- To measure length (cm).
- To measure length (m).

Science:

Living Things and their Habitats

- To identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited. (English and World habitats).
- To explore food chains in a habitat.
- Talk about what they have found out.

Setting Descriptions

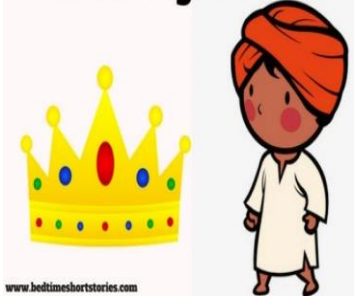
To write a description of an Indian town and village.

India

- To know where India is.
- To identify the human and physical features of India.

- Recognise human features on aerial photographs and plan perspectives.
- To learn about famous people in Indian History.
- To compare India to England.
- To compare festivals in India- Holi and Raksha Bandhan.

Music:

Our Land

- Exploring timbre and texture to understand how sounds can be descriptive.
- Matching descriptive sounds to images.
- Identifying ways of producing sounds.
- Listening to and evaluating composition.
- Rehearsing and refining to develop a performance.

RSHE:

Unkind Behaviour, Bullying and Friendships

- To know how and why friendships change.
- To know the qualities that make a good friend.
- PANTS and NSPCC work.
- To know if I am being bullied and what to do if I am being bullied.
- To know some strategies to resolve disputes.

- Blend/mix colours with pastels- Holi Festival.

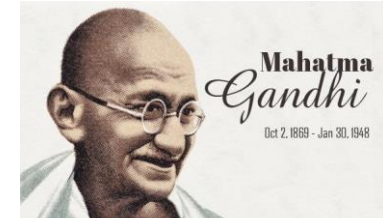
PE:
