Water bottles

We always encourage children to stay hydrated and they should bring a bottle for their own personal use throughout the school day. Water bottles are kept in the classroom and should be clearly marked with your child's name to avoid accidental "sharing". We expect water bottles to be taken home to be washed at the end of each school week. You may encourage your child to bring their bottle home more frequently if you wish.

Water bottles should be sturdy, screw cap or sports cap and contain water, not diluted squash or juice etc. Children are expected to maintain healthy choices during the school day and sugars in juices are not good for focused learning.

School Milk

Milk is available for all children in school from our supplier: 'Cool Milk'.

If your child is under five, their milk is free as a result of funding from the UK government. We will automatically register your child for their free school milk on your behalf by providing 'Cool Milk' with your child's name and date of birth. This removes the requirement for you to complete a registration process. You only need to let us know if you **do not** want us to register your child for free school milk by returning the slip below.

Once your child turns five, *you will need to apply for milk online* (please see leaflet included in your pack), which is at a subsidised rate, should you wish to continue with the scheme. If your child continues to receive milk in school, we will also maintain their enrolment in the free fruit and vegetable scheme detailed in this pack.

All information handled by the 'Cool Milk' group is processed in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998. All personal information is securely stored on Cool Milk's UK servers and is never passed on to third parties without your permission.
